Teaching and learning at Carrum Primary School is engaging and exciting.



Our students and parents made this very clear when talking to our **Review Panel** over the past couple of weeks. It was great to get feedback from our community about what they value about our school and what we can do to get even better. It was recognised that the learning journey that we all go through at Carrum Primary School enables us to grow and develop. **Over the past 18 months, we have seen a shift in our curriculum and assessment programs, to ensure students are**

provided with evidence based programs, which support the development of all individuals.

Within these programs, we continue to develop consistency of practice and look at the areas in which we can make the greatest impact on student learning. One aspect of this work relates to providing effective feedback to students. We know that through receiving multiple sources of positive constructive feedback, students can reflect on their learning goals and targets, to gain a more comprehensive understanding of the task at hand. When listening to the students

explaining their learning to the Review Panel last Thursday it was clear that they value this feedback and recognise how it helps them to improve. It was also evident that the consistency of teaching practice has made a impact on improved student outcomes across all grades.

Over the coming weeks we will be



commencing our whole school transition program to prepare students 2018.

As part of this program all students will participate in **three 'Up Days'**. These transition days that support students to understand the expectations placed upon them in the next grade level. We have done a significant amount of work to ensure students have the right preparation for the next year level.



Teachers use these sessions to help with placing students in their grades for 2018. It should be noted, that the grouping for these sessions are not an indication of the grade in which your child will be in the following year. **As part of this planning stage parents' with genuine considerations about their child's learning can put them in writing to me by Friday 17th November.** It is important to note that while we will consider these requests the process of placing students in grades is a very long and comprehensive process and the needs of the whole school will be taken into account. All requests should be limited to the specific learning needs of your child.



In 2018 Carrum Primary School will be working with 'TheirCare' to provide before and after school care at Carrum Primary School.

Earlier in the year we surveyed our school community and there was overwhelming support to run these programs at the school.


